RESEARCH METHODS AND STATISTICS

UNDERSTANDING RESEARCH METHODS AND STATISTICS IS FUNDAMENTAL TO INTERPRETING PSYCHOLOGICAL STUDIES AND EVALUATING EVIDENCE. THIS SECTION COVERS ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY RELATED TO EXPERIMENTAL DESIGN, DATA COLLECTION, AND ANALYSIS.

KEY TERMS IN RESEARCH DESIGN

RESEARCH DESIGN VOCABULARY INCLUDES TERMS DESCRIBING HOW STUDIES ARE STRUCTURED TO TEST HYPOTHESES EFFECTIVELY.

- **INDEPENDENT VARIABLE:** THE FACTOR MANIPULATED BY THE RESEARCHER TO OBSERVE ITS EFFECT.
- **DEPENDENT VARIABLE:** THE OUTCOME MEASURED TO ASSESS THE IMPACT OF THE INDEPENDENT VARIABLE.
- **CONTROL GROUP:** A GROUP THAT DOES NOT RECEIVE THE EXPERIMENTAL TREATMENT, USED FOR COMPARISON.
- **RANDOM ASSIGNMENT:** THE PROCESS OF ASSIGNING PARTICIPANTS TO GROUPS BY CHANCE TO REDUCE BIAS.
- **DOUBLE-BLIND PROCEDURE:** A METHOD WHERE NEITHER PARTICIPANTS NOR EXPERIMENTERS KNOW WHO RECEIVES THE TREATMENT TO PREVENT BIAS.

STATISTICAL VOCABULARY

STATISTICAL TERMS ARE CRITICAL FOR ANALYZING DATA AND DETERMINING THE SIGNIFICANCE OF RESULTS IN PSYCHOLOGICAL RESEARCH.

- **MEAN:** THE AVERAGE SCORE IN A DATA SET.
- **MEDIAN:** THE MIDDLE SCORE WHEN DATA ARE ORDERED.
- **MODE:** THE MOST FREQUENTLY OCCURRING SCORE.
- **STANDARD DEVIATION:** A MEASURE OF VARIABILITY WITHIN A DATA SET.
- **CORRELATION COEFFICIENT:** A STATISTIC EXPRESSING THE STRENGTH AND DIRECTION OF THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN TWO VARIABLES.
- **STATISTICAL SIGNIFICANCE:** INDICATES THE LIKELIHOOD THAT A RESULT IS NOT DUE TO CHANCE.

BIOLOGICAL BASES OF BEHAVIOR

THE BIOLOGICAL BASES OF BEHAVIOR SECTION INCLUDES TERMS DESCRIBING THE NERVOUS SYSTEM, BRAIN STRUCTURES, AND THE PHYSIOLOGICAL PROCESSES THAT INFLUENCE BEHAVIOR AND MENTAL PROCESSES.

NEURONS AND NEUROTRANSMITTERS

NEURONS ARE THE BASIC UNITS OF THE NERVOUS SYSTEM, AND NEUROTRANSMITTERS ARE CHEMICAL MESSENGERS FACILITATING COMMUNICATION BETWEEN NEURONS.

- **NEURON:** A NERVE CELL RESPONSIBLE FOR RECEIVING AND TRANSMITTING INFORMATION.
- **DENDRITES:** BRANCH-LIKE STRUCTURES THAT RECEIVE MESSAGES FROM OTHER NEURONS.
- **AXON:** THE FIBER THAT TRANSMITS IMPULSES AWAY FROM THE NEURON'S CELL BODY.
- **SYNAPSE:** THE JUNCTION BETWEEN NEURONS WHERE NEUROTRANSMITTERS ARE RELEASED.
- **DOPAMINE:** A NEUROTRANSMITTER INVOLVED IN REWARD, MOTIVATION, AND MOTOR CONTROL.
- **SEROTONIN:** A NEUROTRANSMITTER LINKED TO MOOD REGULATION AND SLEEP.

BRAIN STRUCTURES AND FUNCTIONS

KEY BRAIN STRUCTURES ARE ASSOCIATED WITH SPECIFIC PSYCHOLOGICAL FUNCTIONS AND BEHAVIORS.

- **CEREBRAL CORTEX:** THE OUTER LAYER OF THE BRAIN INVOLVED IN HIGHER-ORDER FUNCTIONS SUCH AS THINKING AND DECISION-MAKING.
- **AMYGDALA:** A LIMBIC SYSTEM STRUCTURE INVOLVED IN EMOTION REGULATION AND FEAR RESPONSES.

- **HIPPOCAMPUS:** CRITICAL FOR MEMORY FORMATION AND SPATIAL NAVIGATION.
- **HYPOTHALAMUS:** REGULATES BODILY FUNCTIONS SUCH AS HUNGER, THIRST, AND TEMPERATURE.
- **BRAINSTEM:** CONTROLS AUTONOMIC FUNCTIONS NECESSARY FOR SURVIVAL.

SENSATION AND PERCEPTION

SENSATION AND PERCEPTION VOCABULARY PERTAINS TO HOW SENSORY INFORMATION IS RECEIVED AND INTERPRETED BY THE BRAIN TO CONSTRUCT OUR EXPERIENCE OF THE ENVIRONMENT.

SENSORY PROCESSES

SENSATION INVOLVES DETECTING STIMULI THROUGH SENSORY ORGANS, WHILE PERCEPTION ENTAILS INTERPRETING THESE SIGNALS.

- **ABSOLUTE THRESHOLD:** THE MINIMUM STIMULUS INTENSITY REQUIRED TO DETECT A STIMULUS 50% OF THE TIME.
- **DIFFERENCE THRESHOLD (JUST NOTICEABLE DIFFERENCE):** THE SMALLEST DETECTABLE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN TWO STIMULI.
- **SENSORY ADAPTATION:** THE DIMINISHED SENSITIVITY TO A CONSTANT STIMULUS OVER TIME.
- **TRANSDUCTION:** THE PROCESS OF CONVERTING SENSORY INPUT INTO NEURAL SIGNALS.

PERCEPTUAL PRINCIPLES

PERCEPTION IS GUIDED BY ORGANIZATIONAL PRINCIPLES AND CONTEXTUAL INFLUENCES.

- **GESTALT PRINCIPLES:** RULES THAT DESCRIBE HOW HUMANS NATURALLY ORGANIZE SENSORY INFORMATION (E.G., PROXIMITY, SIMILARITY, CLOSURE).
- **DEPTH PERCEPTION:** THE ABILITY TO PERCEIVE THE WORLD IN THREE DIMENSIONS AND JUDGE DISTANCE.
- **PERCEPTUAL SET:** A MENTAL PREDISPOSITION TO PERCEIVE ONE THING AND NOT ANOTHER BASED ON EXPECTATIONS AND EXPERIENCES.

LEARNING AND CONDITIONING

THIS SECTION INCLUDES VOCABULARY RELATED TO BEHAVIORAL LEARNING THEORIES, INCLUDING CLASSICAL AND OPERANT CONDITIONING, AS WELL AS OBSERVATIONAL LEARNING.

CLASSICAL CONDITIONING TERMS

CLASSICAL CONDITIONING INVOLVES LEARNING THROUGH ASSOCIATIONS BETWEEN STIMULI.

- **UNCONDITIONED STIMULUS (UCS):** A STIMULUS THAT NATURALLY TRIGGERS A RESPONSE.

- **UNCONDITIONED RESPONSE (UCR):** THE NATURAL REACTION TO THE UCS.
- **CONDITIONED STIMULUS (CS):** A PREVIOUSLY NEUTRAL STIMULUS THAT, AFTER ASSOCIATION WITH THE UCS, TRIGGERS A CONDITIONED RESPONSE.
- **CONDITIONED RESPONSE (CR):** THE LEARNED RESPONSE TO THE CONDITIONED STIMULUS.

OPERANT CONDITIONING TERMS

OPERANT CONDITIONING FOCUSES ON CONSEQUENCES THAT INFLUENCE VOLUNTARY BEHAVIOR.

- **REINFORCEMENT:** A CONSEQUENCE THAT INCREASES THE LIKELIHOOD OF A BEHAVIOR.
- **POSITIVE REINFORCEMENT:** ADDING A DESIRABLE STIMULUS TO INCREASE BEHAVIOR.
- **NEGATIVE REINFORCEMENT:** REMOVING AN AVERSIVE STIMULUS TO INCREASE BEHAVIOR.
- **PUNISHMENT:** A CONSEQUENCE THAT DECREASES THE LIKELIHOOD OF A BEHAVIOR.
- **SHAPING:** GRADUALLY REINFORCING SUCCESSIVE APPROXIMATIONS TOWARD A DESIRED BEHAVIOR.

OBSERVATIONAL LEARNING

LEARNING THAT OCCURS THROUGH WATCHING OTHERS IS AN IMPORTANT CONCEPT IN SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY.

- **MODELING:** IMITATING THE BEHAVIOR OF OTHERS.
- **MIRROR NEURONS:** NEURONS THAT FIRE BOTH WHEN PERFORMING AN ACTION AND WHEN OBSERVING ANOTHER PERFORM THE SAME ACTION.

MEMORY AND COGNITION

MEMORY AND COGNITION ENCOMPASS TERMS RELATED TO HOW INFORMATION IS ENCODED, STORED, RETRIEVED, AND HOW THINKING PROCESSES OCCUR.

MEMORY PROCESSES

MEMORY INVOLVES MULTIPLE STAGES CRITICAL FOR INFORMATION RETENTION AND RECALL.

- **ENCODING:** THE PROCESS OF CONVERTING SENSORY INPUT INTO A FORM THAT CAN BE STORED.
- **STORAGE:** MAINTAINING INFORMATION OVER TIME.
- **RETRIEVAL:** ACCESSING STORED INFORMATION WHEN NEEDED.
- **SHORT-TERM MEMORY:** TEMPORARY STORAGE WITH LIMITED CAPACITY.
- **LONG-TERM MEMORY:** DURABLE STORAGE OF INFORMATION OVER EXTENDED PERIODS.

- **WORKING MEMORY:** ACTIVE PROCESSING AND MANIPULATION OF INFORMATION IN SHORT-TERM STORAGE.

COGNITIVE FUNCTIONS

COGNITIVE VOCABULARY DESCRIBES MENTAL PROCESSES INVOLVED IN PROBLEM-SOLVING, DECISION-MAKING, AND LANGUAGE.

- **HEURISTICS:** MENTAL SHORTCUTS USED TO SIMPLIFY DECISION-MAKING.
- **ALGORITHMS:** STEP-BY-STEP PROCEDURES GUARANTEED TO SOLVE PROBLEMS.
- **CONFIRMATION BIAS:** THE TENDENCY TO SEARCH FOR INFORMATION THAT CONFIRMS EXISTING BELIEFS.
- **LANGUAGE ACQUISITION:** THE PROCESS BY WHICH HUMANS LEARN LANGUAGE.

DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY

DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY VOCABULARY FOCUSES ON THE PHYSICAL, COGNITIVE, AND SOCIAL CHANGES THAT OCCUR THROUGHOUT THE LIFESPAN.

STAGES OF DEVELOPMENT

DEVELOPMENT OCCURS IN DISTINCT STAGES MARKED BY SPECIFIC MILESTONES.

- **SENSORIMOTOR STAGE:** PIAGET'S STAGE WHERE INFANTS LEARN THROUGH SENSORY EXPERIENCE AND MOTOR ACTIONS.
- **PREOPERATIONAL STAGE:** STAGE CHARACTERIZED BY SYMBOLIC THINKING AND EGOCENTRISM.
- **CONCRETE OPERATIONAL STAGE:** DEVELOPMENT OF LOGICAL THINKING ABOUT CONCRETE EVENTS.
- **FORMAL OPERATIONAL STAGE:** ABILITY TO THINK ABSTRACTLY AND HYPOTHETICALLY.

ATTACHMENT AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

ATTACHMENT THEORIES EXPLAIN EMOTIONAL BONDS BETWEEN INFANTS AND CAREGIVERS.

- **SECURE ATTACHMENT:** A HEALTHY EMOTIONAL BOND MARKED BY COMFORT AND TRUST.
- **INSECURE ATTACHMENT:** ANXIOUS OR AVOIDANT EMOTIONAL BONDS LEADING TO DIFFICULTIES IN RELATIONSHIPS.
- **ERIKSON'S PSYCHOSOCIAL STAGES:** EIGHT STAGES OF PSYCHOSOCIAL DEVELOPMENT FROM INFANCY TO ADULTHOOD.

MOTIVATION AND EMOTION

VOCABULARY RELATED TO MOTIVATION AND EMOTION EXPLAINS WHAT DRIVES BEHAVIOR AND HOW FEELINGS ARE EXPERIENCED

AND EXPRESSED.

THEORIES OF MOTIVATION

MOTIVATION THEORIES EXPLORE THE ORIGINS AND REGULATION OF BEHAVIOR.

- **DRIVE-REDUCTION THEORY:** MOTIVATION ARISES FROM BIOLOGICAL NEEDS TO REDUCE INTERNAL TENSION.
- **MOTIVE:** AN INTERNAL STATE THAT DIRECTS BEHAVIOR TOWARD ACHIEVING A GOAL.
- **MASLOW'S HIERARCHY OF NEEDS:** A PYRAMID OF HUMAN NEEDS FROM PHYSIOLOGICAL TO SELF-ACTUALIZATION.

EMOTION CONCEPTS

EMOTION VOCABULARY INCLUDES PHYSIOLOGICAL AND COGNITIVE COMPONENTS OF FEELINGS.

- **JAMES-LANGE THEORY:** EMOTIONS RESULT FROM PHYSIOLOGICAL REACTIONS TO STIMULI.
- **CANNON-BARD THEORY:** PHYSIOLOGICAL AROUSAL AND EMOTIONAL EXPERIENCE OCCUR SIMULTANEOUSLY.
- **SCHACHTER-SINGER TWO-FACTOR THEORY:** EMOTION DEPENDS ON PHYSIOLOGICAL AROUSAL AND COGNITIVE LABELING.

PERSONALITY THEORIES
