## THE RENAISSANCE: REVIVAL OF ART AND LEARNING

MARTIN LUTHER'S PUBLICATION OF THE 95 THESES IN 1517 IS WIDELY REGARDED AS THE CATALYST FOR THE REFORMATION. LUTHER CRITICIZED THE CATHOLIC CHURCH'S SALE OF INDULGENCES AND OTHER ABUSES, ADVOCATING FOR A RETURN TO BIBLICAL AUTHORITY AND FAITH-BASED SALVATION. HIS IDEAS QUICKLY SPREAD, FACILITATED BY THE PRINTING PRESS, INSPIRING REFORM MOVEMENTS THROUGHOUT GERMANY AND BEYOND. LUTHER'S CHALLENGES TO PAPAL AUTHORITY IGNITED DEBATES THAT TRANSFORMED CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY AND ECCLESIASTICAL STRUCTURES.

### PROTESTANT DENOMINATIONS AND DOCTRINAL CHANGES

THE REFORMATION LED TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF VARIOUS PROTESTANT CHURCHES, INCLUDING LUTHERANISM, CALVINISM, AND ANGLICANISM. ## THE AGE OF EXPLORATION AND EXPANSION

## CONSEQUENCES OF EUROPEAN EXPANSION
