CAUSES OF THE FRENCH REVOLUTION

SOCIAL CAUSES

FRENCH SOCIETY WAS DIVIDED INTO THREE ESTATES: THE FIRST ESTATE (CLERGY), THE SECOND ESTATE (NOBILITY), AND THE THIRD ESTATE (COMMONERS). THE THIRD ESTATE, DESPITE MAKING UP THE MAJORITY OF THE POPULATION, SUFFERED FROM HEAVY TAXATION AND LIMITED POLITICAL POWER, CREATING DEEP SOCIAL INEQUALITIES. ENLIGHTENMENT IDEAS PROMOTING LIBERTY, EQUALITY, AND FRATERNITY INSPIRED THE COMMON PEOPLE TO CHALLENGE THE EXISTING SOCIAL HIERARCHY.

ECONOMIC CAUSES

ECONOMIC DISTRESS PLAYED A SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN PRECIPITATING THE REVOLUTION. FRANCE FACED A MOUNTING NATIONAL DEBT DUE TO INVOLVEMENT IN COSTLY WARS, INCLUDING THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION. POOR HARVESTS IN THE LATE 1780S LED TO FOOD SHORTAGES AND INCREASED BREAD PRICES, EXACERBATING THE HARDSHIPS FACED BY PEASANTS AND URBAN WORKERS. THE FINANCIAL CRISIS UNDERMINED THE MONARCHY'S AUTHORITY AND INTENSIFIED PUBLIC UNREST.

MAJOR PHASES OF THE FRENCH REVOLUTION

THE FRENCH REVOLUTION UNFOLDED THROUGH SEVERAL DISTINCT PHASES, EACH MARKED BY SIGNIFICANT EVENTS AND SHIFTS IN POWER. THESE PHASES ILLUSTRATE THE REVOLUTION'S DYNAMIC NATURE AND ITS EVOLVING GOALS.

ESTATES-GENERAL AND NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

IN 1789, KING LOUIS XVI CONVENED THE ESTATES-GENERAL TO ADDRESS THE FINANCIAL CRISIS. HOWEVER, DISPUTES OVER VOTING PROCEDURES LED THE THIRD ESTATE TO PROCLAIM ITSELF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, ASSERTING ITS RIGHT TO REPRESENT THE PEOPLE. THE TENNIS COURT OATH FOLLOWED, SIGNALING A COMMITMENT TO DRAFTING A NEW CONSTITUTION AND CHALLENGING ROYAL AUTHORITY.

STORMING OF THE BASTILLE AND POPULAR UPRISING

THE STORMING OF THE BASTILLE ON JULY 14, 1789, BECAME A SYMBOLIC ACT OF REVOLUTION. IT REPRESENTED THE REJECTION OF MONARCHICAL TYRANNY AND SPARKED NATIONWIDE UPRISINGS. PEASANTS IN THE COUNTRYSIDE REVOLTED AGAINST FEUDAL PRIVILEGES DURING THE GREAT FEAR, FURTHER DESTABILIZING THE ANCIENT REGIME.

THE REIGN OF TERROR

FOLLOWING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC IN 1792, RADICAL FACTIONS LED BY THE JACOBINS GAINED CONTROL. UNDER MAXIMILIEN ROBESPIERRE, THE REIGN OF TERROR SOUGHT TO PURGE ENEMIES OF THE REVOLUTION THROUGH MASS EXECUTIONS. THIS PERIOD WAS CHARACTERIZED BY POLITICAL REPRESSION AND WIDESPREAD FEAR, SIGNIFICANTLY IMPACTING THE REVOLUTION'S TRAJECTORY.

THE RISE OF NAPOLEON BONAPARTE

AFTER YEARS OF POLITICAL INSTABILITY, NAPOLEON BONAPARTE EMERGED AS A DOMINANT FIGURE, EVENTUALLY DECLARING HIMSELF EMPEROR IN 1804. HIS RISE MARKED THE END OF THE REVOLUTIONARY PHASE AND THE BEGINNING OF A NEW ERA IN FRENCH AND EUROPEAN HISTORY, WITH LASTING IMPLICATIONS FOR GOVERNANCE AND LAW.

REVOLUTIONARY IDEOLOGIES

- **LIBERALISM:** EMPHASIZED INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS, CONSTITUTIONAL GOVERNMENT, AND EQUALITY BEFORE THE LAW.
